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Monee Elementary, along with the entire Crete Monee District 201 U, understands the importance of educating our students and parents about Social Media as a whole, beyond Cyberbullying. This year, our campaign will take place for the entire school year. In order to keep our school and community involved about social media awareness, we have provided a brief overview of our campaign and our calendar highlighting our plan of action. Some topics throughout the year will include: safety (posting pictures), etiquette (permission before you post a pic of someone), dangers of gossiping and spreading rumors and responsible behavior (separating fact from fiction), do's and don'ts, and being safe, respectful, and responsible. Every year at Monee, we provide our students with monthly character traits and students create projects around these themes. In order to continue this initiative and educate our students about social media, we have combined our monthly character traits and our social media campaign awareness topics.

Communicating to Parents

- Teachers will place the social media topics in their weekly newsletters. Teachers will ask that parents share their feelings and beliefs at home with their child.
- Our school's monthly newsletters will provide brief information specific to our social media campaign. The social media topics currently reflect our monthly character traits.
- In order to keep the community informed, we will also provide this information to parents by placing it on our school website.
- Parents will have the option of helping their child on the character trait projects focusing on “Caring” and “Citizenship” from a social media perspective. This will take place from January 28, 2019 to April 5, 2019. (This includes two projects)
- Throughout the year, many of our school clubs will create and display projects at the school's primary entrance for parents to view.



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Communicating to Students

- **August/September:** For the month of September, the office will conduct announcements on the topic of being trustworthy on social media. They will start on August 27, 2018. Thereafter, announcements will take place on Monday and Friday until September 29, 2018. The first two announcements will introduce the concepts of social media.
- **October:** 5th grade Monee students and staff have something planned based upon the topic, “Being Respectful Here, There and Everywhere on Social Media”. Please stay tuned!
- **November:** Monee Ambassadors will conduct announcements on the topic of “Being Responsible Here, There and Everywhere on Social Media” on Mondays and Wednesdays. In addition, they will create social media projects that focus on being responsible on various social media applications.
- **December:** For the month of December, our Safety Patrol Club will take one week in December and the Mentoring Club will take the next. They will conduct announcements throughout the week talking about being responsible from a social media perspective; especially during the holiday season.
- **January:** The Character Club is in charge of the month of January. The topic is “Showing Fairness here, there and everywhere on Social Media”. As they plan, more information will be available.
- **February & March:** The entire school will be doing projects on social media specific to Caring and Citizenship. Each grade, with the exception of Kindergarten, will conduct announcements. The grade level team, student or teacher can create the announcements. During these two months, teachers will have class discussions on the two topics. The schedule is located above. Incentives will be offered to students who complete projects.
- **April:** Student Council and the Recycling Club will have a plan in place for the month of April focusing on “Citizenship” as it relates to social media.
- **May:** Teachers will create once a week fun filled activities about social media. In addition, a school-wide event will take place to close the Social Media Campaign of 2018-2019.
